Mississauga, ON, November 2025, The **16th Canadian EdTech Leadership Al Summit**, hosted at the University of Toronto Mississauga, brought together over 300 national and international education leaders, policymakers, innovators, and students to chart the future of Al-enhanced learning. The energy was electric as delegates co-created insights, explored hands-on innovations, and helped shape a bold vision for a more equitable, human-centered digital future.

Today, I'm thrilled to share the **Top 10 Crowd-Sourced Takeaways**, captured directly from our delegates and partners who contributed to this milestone event.

1. Human-Centered AI is the Future

Our delegates affirmed that AI must *empower*, not replace, educators. Human connection, empathy, and purpose remain the cornerstone of meaningful learning. Technology amplifies impact, but people lead the transformation.

2. Equity, Access & Inclusion Must Lead the Way

Speakers emphasized that sustainable AI adoption must *intentionally close gaps*. Every learner, regardless of background or circumstance, deserves to benefit from the rapid digital transformation reshaping Canadian education.

3. Policy Must Keep Pace with Innovation

Education leaders called for agile, forward-thinking Al policies that evolve with technological change. These frameworks must be collaborative and informed by the voices of educators, students, and communities.

4. Pedagogy Before Technology



A resounding message emerged: learning goals, not tools, must drive decision-making. The "why" and "how" of teaching remain far more important than the "what" of AI solutions.

5. Professional Learning Builds Confidence

Educators left inspired yet clear-eyed about their needs: continuous, hands-on professional development is essential to navigate AI with confidence, curiosity, and creativity.

6. Al Literacy for All

Understanding how AI works, its strengths, its limits, and its ethical considerations, is now a foundational skill for learners and leaders alike. AI literacy is the new digital literacy.

7. Ethics & Responsible Design Are Non-Negotiable

Transparency, data privacy, and fairness must guide every Al initiative. Delegates called for ethical frameworks to be integrated at every level of EdTech development and implementation.

8. Collaboration & Networking Spark Innovation

Innovation thrives in community. Delegates praised the interactive networking zones, discovery sessions, and cross-sector connections spanning K–12, post-secondary, government, and industry.

9. Hands-On Learning Delivers High Impact

Live demos, from AI storytelling to powerful design tools like Canva AI, were among the most celebrated Summit experiences, blending creativity with real-world application and inspiring educators to experiment boldly.

10. Curiosity Over Certainty

Perhaps the most powerful insight: we don't need all the answers yet. What matters most is maintaining a growth mindset, being curious, adaptable, and open, as AI continues to reshape education.
